Mark Bauerlein is Senior Editor at First Things and Professor of English at Emory University. For two years (2003-05) he served as Director of the Office of Research and Analysis at the National Endowment for the Arts. His books include *Literary Criticism: An Autopsy* (1997), *The Pragmatic Mind: Explorations in the Psychology of Belief* (1997), and *The Dumbest Generation: How the Digital Age Stupefies Young Americans and Jeopardizes Our Future* (2008). His essays have appeared in *PMLA*, *Partisan Review*, *Wilson Quarterly*, *Commentary*, and *New Criterion*, and his commentaries and reviews in the *Wall Street Journal*, *Washington Post*, *Boston Globe*, *Weekly Standard*, *The Guardian*, *Chronicle of Higher Education*, and other national periodicals.

Dr. Bauerlein will join Bucknell faculty members for a public discussion of the contribution of the '60s counterculture to contemporary American culture.
