

A Conversation with Todd Gitlin

Todd Gitlin is professor of journalism and sociology at Columbia University and one of America's most well-known public intellectuals. He is the author of sixteen books, which include scholarly monographs, commentaries on politics and contemporary affairs, and several novels. He is a former president of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS). His forthcoming book is a novel set in the 1960s.

Professor Gitlin will discuss his participation in social activism during the 1960s, his work analyzing that period, and his thoughts on the consequences of the '60s for contemporary America.
