

REVISITING THE WAR IN VIETNAM WITH MARK MOYAR

Mark Moyar is the Director of the Office of Civilian-Military Cooperation at USAID. He holds a B.A. summa cum laude from Harvard and a Ph.D. from Cambridge. He is a member of the Hoover Institution Working Group on the Role of Military History in Contemporary Conflict, and a Senior Fellow at the Foreign Policy Research Institute. Dr. Moyar is the author of two groundbreaking histories of the Vietnam War: *Triumph Forsaken: The Vietnam War, 1954-1965* and *Phoenix and the Birds of Prey: Counterinsurgency and Counterterrorism in Vietnam.* At present, he is working on the sequel to *Triumph Forsaken*. His articles have appeared in the New York Times, the Washington Post, the Wall Street Journal, and numerous other publications.

Dr. Moyar will join us for a wide-ranging public discussion of American military involvement in Vietnam and the ways in which it was affected by political decision-making, mass media coverage, and other factors.
